

Stacy McQuabbie; Jackie Pearce (Defendants) and Between Stacy McQuabbie; Jackie Pearce; Verna Friday (Plaintiffs by Counterclaim) v. Henvey Inlet First Nation; Her Majesty the Queen Elizabeth II; Her Majesty the Queen in the Right of Canada; Her Majesty the Queen in the Right of Ontario; Pope Benedict XVI; The Vatican State (Defendants to Counterclaim), Ontario Superior Court of Justice, court reference #CV-2007-155; Chief Jim Twain personally and on behalf of all other members of the Temagami First Nation and the Teme-Augama Anishnaba v. RE: Northland Power Inc. - McLean's Mountain Wind Farm Project

Northland Power Inc. is planning a 77 MW wind farm south of Little Current, in the Municipality of North Eastern Manitoulin and the Islands, Ontario. This project will ultimately consist of about 43 turbines.

The project is being conducted in accordance with the requirements of both the Canadian Environmental Assessment Act (CEAA) and the Ontario Environmental Assessment Act (EAA) and is subject to the environmental screening process for electricity / wind farm projects. The applicable guideline that are being followed are the "Environmental Impact Statement Guidelines for Screenings of Inland Wind Farms under the CEAA" and the "Guide to Environmental Assessment Requirements for Electricity Projects (March 2001)" provided by the Ontario Ministry of the Environment. The federal and provincial EA processes include public and review agency consultation, evaluation of alternatives, assessment of the impacts of the proposed project and identification of measures to mitigate any adverse impacts. Upon completion of the Study, an Environmental Screening Report (ESR) will be filed on public record.

The ESR is being prepared by Dillon Consulting Ltd. and will consider the potential for a variety of effects including for example: noise, visual, loss of vegetation, loss of agricultural land, effects to birds and other wildlife and effects to cultural resources.

The first Public Information Centre (PIC#1) was held in June 2004 to present to the public background information on the project and wind power, various alternatives being considered, and the next steps that will be followed in the project process. As a restart point of the proposed project the second Public Information Centre (PIC#2) will be held on June 25, 2009 to provide update on the project, to present to the public the results of environmental studies, evaluations of the siting of the wind turbine and transmission line route, assessment of project impacts on the environment with potential mitigation measures, identification of residual effects, and specific information on the project. The public will be encouraged to provide their comments throughout the project to ensure that concerns can be adequately addressed. Details of the PIC #2 are provided in the attached Notice.

Upon completion of the Study, an Environmental Screening Report (ESR) describing the project will be developed and made available for public review for a period of 30 calendar days. Notification of the date, time and location of the filing of the ESR will be made through newspaper notices and letters mailed to those in the project's contact database.

In an effort to create a comprehensive Aboriginal consultation program, we are developing a mailing list that includes Aboriginal groups who may have an interest in the area, including local First Nations and Métis organizations. Therefore, could you please advise and provide information on:

- · Specific claims in this area;
- · Comprehensive claims in the area;

- Any litigation or legal activity involving local Aboriginal groups; and
- A list of Aboriginal groups who may have an interest in the project area.

We are particularly interested in obtaining information on what First Nations Communities need to be consulted regarding the proposed project. Consultation with the following First Nations in the study is ongoing:

- · The Aundec Omnikaning First Nation;
- · Sheguiandah First Nation;
- · Wikwemikong First Nation; and,
- M'Chigeeng First Nation,

For your reference I am also attaching a map of the study area.

We appreciate your prompt response in this matter as we would like to create a comprehensive Aboriginal consultation program.

Please note you should also be receiving a hard copy of a letter requesting similar information mailed to your attention this week.

This letter is to confirm our ongoing communications with Northland Power regarding the proposed establishment of a Wind generation facility to be located at Mclean's Mountain site, south of Little Current, Ontario - Manitoulin Island.

Representatives of the Wikwemikong Unceded First Nation have been meeting with representatives of Northland Power since the summer of 2006 regarding the progress of respective wind energy developments on Manitoulin Island.

During this time, information has been shared and a positive relationship established in order to outline options to advance the wind energy projects of both Wikwemikong and Northland Power. Specifically, the transmission system on Manitoulin Island is severely restricted as to it's capability to accommodate planned generation projects. Given the location of proposed projects and proponents involved, a short term solution is that Northland Power connect to the 115 KV line at the Manitoulin TS. Other proponents (including Wikwemikong) on the Hydro One distribution queue can proceed with projects under the re-issued standard offer program. To accommodate this solution, Northland Power withdrew pursuance of its connection rights on the Hydro One queue. As a result, Wikwemikong Unceded First Nation and M' Chigeeng First Nation can proceed with their respective community power projects.

We understand that Northland Power is currently bidding into RES III to secure a power purchase agreement to develop the McLean's Mountain project on Manitoulin Island. Northland Power has requested that Wikwemikong confirm that engagement and consultation has commenced and will continue with Wikwemikong through the Environmental Assessment and permitting process. Further to this, a consultation and accommodation agreement will be entered into between Northland Power and the Wikwemikong Unceded Indian Reserve.

First Nations Consultations and Engagement

Over the past 5 years we have met formally and informally with four (4) First Nations communities, the Aundec Omnikaning, Sheguiandah, Wikwemikong, and M'Chigeeng to determine their concerns and expectations regarding the proposed Generating Facility. Each of these four communities have different interests and expectations.

Through our meetings with the Aundec Omnikaning Chief, Patrick Mahdahbee, we have learned that their construction company is able to assist in the construction of the proposed Contract Facility. During development they have provided equipment and labour to assist us to drill core samples for a preliminary geotechnical study on 3 locations on McLeans Mountain. Furthermore, we have agreed to stipulate to our BOP contractor, that they use to the extent reasonably possible, employees and machinery from the neighboring first nations communities.

Follow-up meetings have been planned and will focus on reaching the community for their questions, comments, and aboriginal and treaty concerns.

At Sheguiandah Chief Georgina Thompson and former band manager Vicky Corbiere along with current band manager Audrey Bone have all been very supportive of the project. They are currently considering our proposal to them to option to Northland Power Inc. 400 acres of their land which would be included in the proposed Generating Facility. Also, the Chief has requested that we employ a "few" of her young people to try to motivate them into pursuing an interest in the construction or operation of wind farms. She felt that this would be a big win for their community. A meeting in the form of a community forum has been agreed upon and we are awaiting a mutually agreed upon date to do this.

M'Chigeeng and Wikwemikong have both been developing wind projects of their own on Manitouin Island. We met with Chief Joe Hare, of M'Chigeeng and Chief Robert Corbierre of Wikwemikong at our Toronto Office to discuss the availability of distribution system capacity for the Standard Offer Projects that all of our organizations were trying to develop. This contentious issue has been diffused by our indication that we would pursue a larger project connected to the 115 kV transmission system. We have also worked closely with 2 people from Wikwemikong, Roger Peltier, Energy Development and Mellisa Cooper, Environmental Coordinator. We met also met with the economic development officer of the M'Chigeen at a conference in Toronto in August 2008.

Wikwemikong is an Unceded First Nation. Chief Corbiere along with his team in renewable energy development have been in contact with us for the past 4 years. Chief Robert Corbiere and Roger Peltier met with us in Toronto the same time as did Chief Hare of M'Chigeeng. The Chief was very responsive to our offer to assist with supporting their interests in pursuing line upgrades for Manitoulin Island. We were invited to a First Nations Energy Alliance conference hosted by Wikwemikong on Feb 13,14 2007 at Casino Rama. Wikwemikong has a strong interest in new development on Manitoulin and as stated above this includes the development of wind farms. We have

met many times to discuss how we can assist one another and we are to meet with them in the near future to discuss, as consultation, their interest in this area from a first nations rights point of view.

We also met on Site and in Toronto with Pam Simpson from INAC who was able to advise us on some of the First Nations issues, specific to Manitoulin Island.

Also Northland Power Inc. has retained the services of Adam Chamberlain of law firm BLG. Adam is experienced in negotiating mutually acceptable arrangements between developers and First Nation Communities.

Also we have met with Hillary Thatcher, Senior Policy Advisor for First Nation Issues, Ministry of Energy.

Dear Ministers:

The United Chiefs and Councils of Manitoulin ("UCCM") is writing to formally express our concerns regarding the proposed wind farm project on McLean's mountain, Manitoulin Island and to formally register to the Ministries that UCCM at this time is objecting to the development and approval of the wind farm project on McLean's Mountain. The rational for our decision is:

1. There has been No Meaningful Consultation between UCCM First Nations and the proponent. The original meeting between UCCM and the proponent was an agreed information session only (see attached email). This is following our Relationship Law recently developed by UCCM. The purpose of the meeting was introduction and to identify next steps. UCCM Chiefs made it very clear, more information was required to make an informed decision regarding any environmental and health impacts, impacts on Aboriginal and Treaty Rights and the requirement for consultation. The UCCM Chiefs have also indicated any meetings they had with the proponent were only information and were in no way consultations.

UCCM was not surprised when the proponent has issued a Notice of Completion of the Environmental screening report and has indicated in a local news media that they have consulted with UCCM First Nations. This clearly demonstrates to UCCM the business moral and ethics of the proponent. This should also send a clear message to the Ministries the problems associated to delegating the duty to consult with First Nations to proponents, even at procedural aspects. It is also unclear to UCCM the meaning / definition of procedural aspects and request clarification from the Ministries.

As a result of the proponent's action, UCCM and its member First Nation are not interested in meeting with the proponent or any proponent in the future to discuss consultation let alone accommodation. We expect the government to fulfill their legal obligation on the duty to consult and accommodate First Nations as outline in the Supreme Court of Canada decisions. We will no longer meet or have discussions with any proponents regarding consultation or accommodation. It is unfortunate UCCM has to take this position, but it is clear to us, the actions by some proponents, leaves no other alternative.

2. The proponent has failed to provide to UCCM information requested as outline in our letter to the proponent on June 16, 2009. (letter attached)

We find the actions of the proponent to be disrespectful to the UCCM leadership and have significantly damage any future relationship with UCCM First Nations. The actions of the proponent should not be acceptable in any business environment and in particular business environment on Manitoulin Island.

We look forward to an expeditious response from all your Ministries in regarding the above.
