he Draft Project Description Reports, titled Project Description Report Northland Power Solar Empire and Project bescription Report Northland Power Solar Martin's Meadows, describe the Projects as solar electric generating facilities that will utilize photovoltaic (PV) panels installed on fixed solar structures. DC electricity generated from the PV panels is converted to AC electricity by an inverter. The voltage level of the AC electricity produced by the inverter is tepped-up to distribution level voltages by a series of transformers. 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
